ORDER DETERMINING PLAINTIFF A VEXATIOUS LITIGANT

On the 24th day of May, 1999 came on to be heard Defendants' Motion for Order Determining Plaintiff a Vexatious Litigant Requiring Security, Motion for Sanctions for Filing Frivolous Pleadings and Claims, and Motion to Dismiss in the above-styled and numbered cause. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff Rose McCullough, having been found to be a vexatious litigant, is prohibited from filing any new litigation in a court in this state against any party unless she first obtains permission from the local administrative judge in the judicial district in which
