## ORDER DECLARING VICTOR DEL RIO A VEXATIOUS LITIGANT

On this date, the Court heard Defendants' motion to have Victor Del Rio declared a Vexatious Litigant pursuant to section 11.051 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. After reviewing the record, the evidence presented, parties' arguments, and the appropriate authorities, the Court FINDS:

- 1) Defendants' motion has merit;
- 2) there is no reasonable probability that Mr. Del Rio will prevail in this litigation; and
- 3) in the seven-year period immediately preceding this date, Victor Del Rio has commenced at least five *pro se* litigations that have been finally been determined against him.<sup>2</sup>

The Court further FINDS that, after litigation has been determined against Mr. Del Rio, he is attempting to re-litigate the validity of a cause of action, claim, controversy, and issues of fact and law against the same defendants.

Mr. Del Rio also has pending cases in various state and federal courts: Del Rio v. Drexler, et al., Travis County District Court (case number unknown); Del Rio v. Warne, 08-1652, USDC Western District of Pennsylvania; Del Rio v. Del Rio, et al.1:09-CV-807, USDC District of Columbia; Del Rio v. Warne, 1:09-CV-808, USDC District of Columbia, and Del Rio v. Del Rio, et al., U.S. Supreme Court (writ of cert, case number unknown). A review of these cases reveals that Victor Del Rio is repeatedly attempting to relitigate various aspects of the subject matter of the Order entered by the 311<sup>th</sup> District Court Signed November 5, 2008.

Accordingly, the Court Grants Defendants' motion and, pursuant to Chapter 11 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code ORDERS that:

- Victor Del Rio is declared a VEXATIOUS LITIGANT in the State of Texas<sup>3</sup>: 1)
- 2) Victor Del Rio furnish security in this matter in the amount of \$60,000.00, proof of which shall be filed with the Court within fourteen (14) days of the entry of this Order.4

The Court notifies Victor Del Rio that this security is to assure payment to Spring ISD of its reasonable expenses incurred in or in connection with this litigation, including costs and attorney's fees.<sup>5</sup> If Victor Del Rio does not furnish the \$60,000 security within fourteen (14) of the date of this Order, the court shall dismiss this litigation as to Spring ISD. 6 move-Lo

The Court Further ORDERS that Victor Del Rio is prohibited from filing, in propria persona, any new litigation in a court in this statue unless he first obtains permission from the local administrative judge of the Court in which Mr. Del Rio intends to file his litigation.<sup>7</sup>

VICTOR DEL RIO is hereby NOTIFIED that he is subject to punishment for contempt if he fails to obey this Order. If found guilty of contempt, Victor Del Rio may be punished by a fine of up to \$500 and sentenced to six (6) months in jail.
