


**AMENDED  
EMERGENCY ORDER PERMITTING LAWYERS DISPLACED BY  
HURRICANE IKE TO CONTINUE REPRESENTING CLIENTS FROM  
TEMPORARY OFFICES IN TEXAS AND PERMITTING LAWYERS  
RETAINED BY A LEGAL SERVICES PROGRAM TO PRACTICE  
LAW THROUGH THE LEGAL SERVICES PROGRAM**


**ORDERED** that:


1. Until further order of this Court, and notwithstanding Texas Government Code chapter 81, subchapter G, an attorney holding a valid law license issued by Louisiana, who is in good standing with the attorney's respective state bar, and who is displaced from the attorney's home jurisdiction due to Hurricane Ike, is permitted to practice law until October 17, 2008 from a location in Texas as if the attorney were located in the state in which the attorney is licensed.
2. Until further order of this Court, an attorney, though not displaced from the attorney's home jurisdiction due to Hurricane Ike, who is retained by a legal services program funded by the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, is allowed to practice law through the legal services program until October 17, 2008 from a location in Texas. The retained attorney must hold a valid law license from another jurisdiction in the United States and be in good standing with the attorney's respective bar.
3. This order supersedes Order No. 08-9142.


