## ORDER OF THE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS

MISC. DOCKET No. 09- 9050

## IN THE MATTER OF MR. TED S. MURRAY

The Court has reviewed the Motion for Acceptance of Resignation as Attorney and Counselor at Law of Mr. TED S. MURRAY and the Response of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel for the Commission for Lawyer Discipline. The Court concludes each meets the requirements of Part X of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. In the absence of a request by Mr. Murray to withdraw his Motion for Acceptance of Resignation as Attorney and Counselor at Law, the Court deems the criminal conduct and professional misconduct detailed in the Response of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel for the Commission for Lawyer Discipline conclusively established for all purposes. The Court further concludes that acceptance of Mr. Murray's resignation is in the best interest of the public and the profession. The Court accepts Mr. Murray's resignation in lieu of compulsory discipline due to Mr. Murray's conviction for an Intentional Crime.

Therefore, the law license of TED S. MURRAY of Houston, Harris County, Texas, State Bar Number 17869900, is canceled.

Mr. Murray is prohibited from practicing law in the State of Texas. This includes holding himself out as attorney at law, performing legal services for others, giving legal advice to others, accepting any fee directly or indirectly for legal services, appearing as counsel or in any representative capacity in any proceeding in any Texas court or before any Texas administrative body (whether state, county, municipal, or other), or holding himself out to others or using his name in any manner in conjunction with the words "Attorney at Law," "Counselor at Law," or "Lawyer."

Mr. Murray must immediately notify in writing each of her current clients of this resignation.

Mr. Murray shall also return any files, papers, unearned monies, and other property in his possession and belonging to any client, to the respective client or to another attorney at the client's request. Mr. Murray shall file with the STATE BAR OF TEXAS, Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, Texas 78711-2487, within thirty (30) days of the date of this *Order* an affidavit stating that all current clients have been notified of her resignation and that all files, papers, monies, and other property belonging to all clients have been returned.

Additionally, Mr. Murray shall, within thirty (30) days of this *Order*, notify in writing each justice of the peace, judge, magistrate, and chief justice of each court in which he has any matter pending of the terms of this *Order*; the style and cause number of the pending matter(s); and the name, address and telephone number of the client(s) he is representing in that court. Mr. Murray shall file with the STATE BAR OF TEXAS, Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, Texas 78711-2487, within thirty (30) days of the date of this *Order*, an affidavit stating that he has notified in writing each justice of the peace, judge, magistrate, and chief justice of each court in which he has any matter pending of the terms of this *Order*; the style and cause number of the pending matter(s); and the name, address and telephone number of the client(s) he is representing in that court.
