

Respondent failed to timely respond to two (2) grievance complaints after receiving proper notice.

Respondent engaged in conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation when he failed to disclose the worthiness of a personal check at the time of utterance and testified that he, in fact, had disclosed the worthiness. Further investigation revealed he misrepresented the facts to the Grievance Committee.

WHEREFORE, the State Bar of Texas, moves the Court to accept the resignation in lieu of discipline and grant the motion filed by Movant.
