

DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, Lawrence W. Hitchery, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't: Code Ann. §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Dallas County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent by and through his attorney, Mark A. Perez, at 2019 N. Lamar, Third Floor, Dallas, Texas 75202.

III.

On or about August 5, 1996, a complaint was filed against Respondent with the State Bar of

Texas. On August 20, 1996, the State Bar of Texas sent, by certified mail return receipt requested, a letter to Respondent notifying him that a complaint alleging professional misconduct on his part had been filed against him. In said letter, Respondent was advised that, pursuant to Rule 2.09 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, he was required to file a written response with the State Bar of Texas within thirty (30) days of his receipt of the letter. Respondent received the letter on August 21, 1996, and failed to furnish the State Bar of Texas a written response to the complaint within the required thirty (30) days of his receipt of the notification letter, and he failed to timely assert a privilege or other legal ground for his failure to furnish his response.

IV.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraph III, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rule 8.04(a)(8) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

V.

The allegation which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas as the result of a complaint filed against Respondent on or about August 5, 1996.

PRAYER




