



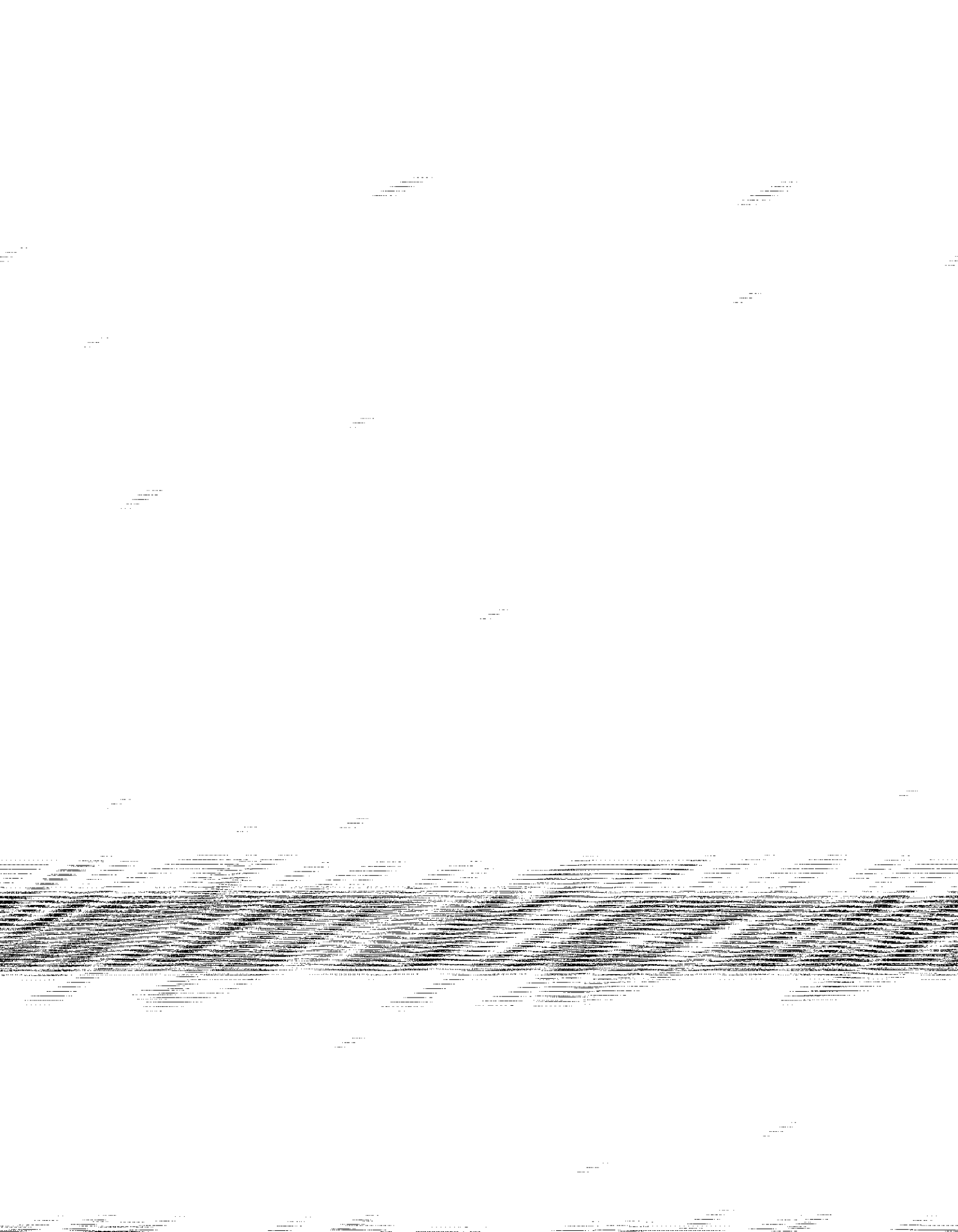

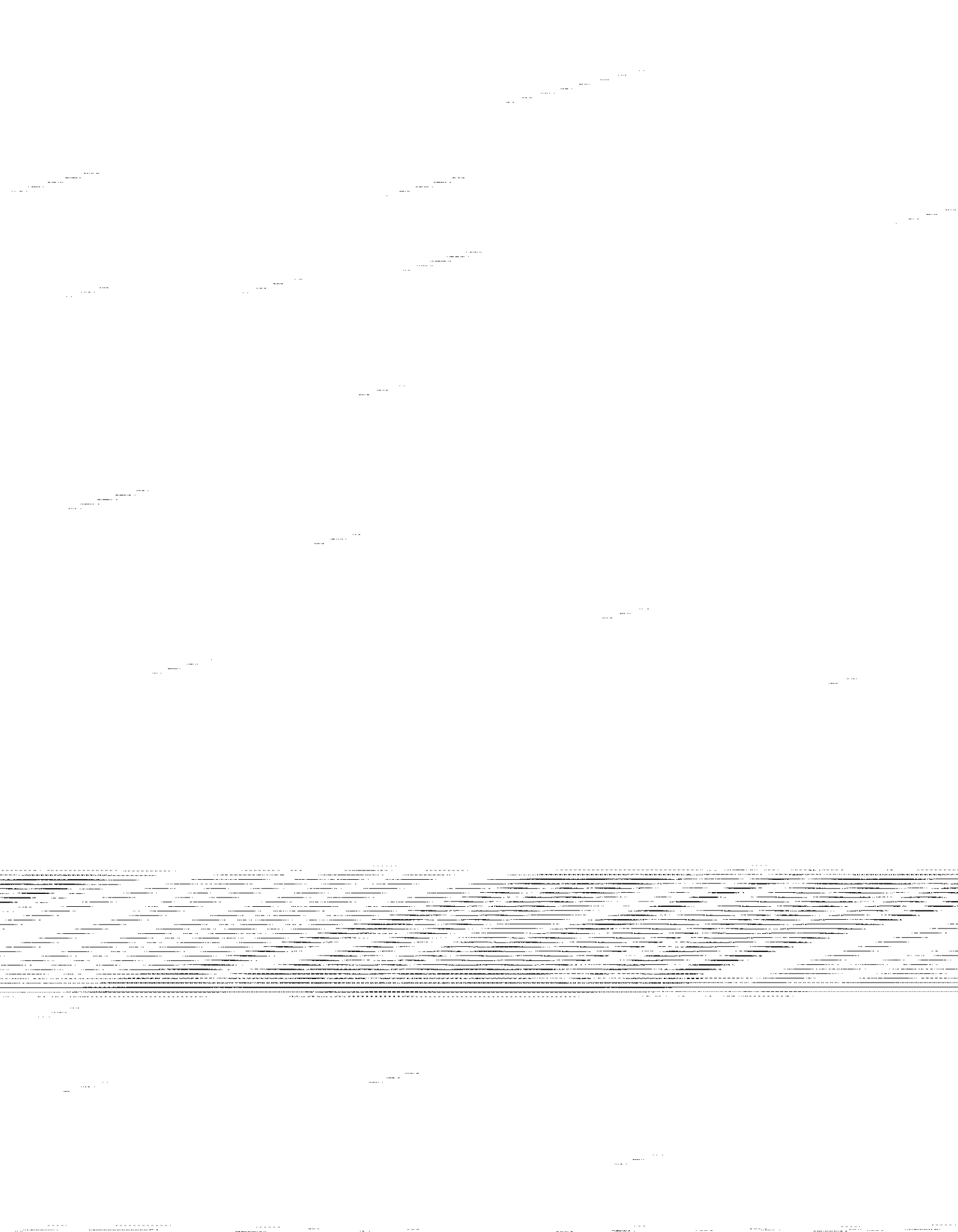

GREEN COMPLAINT

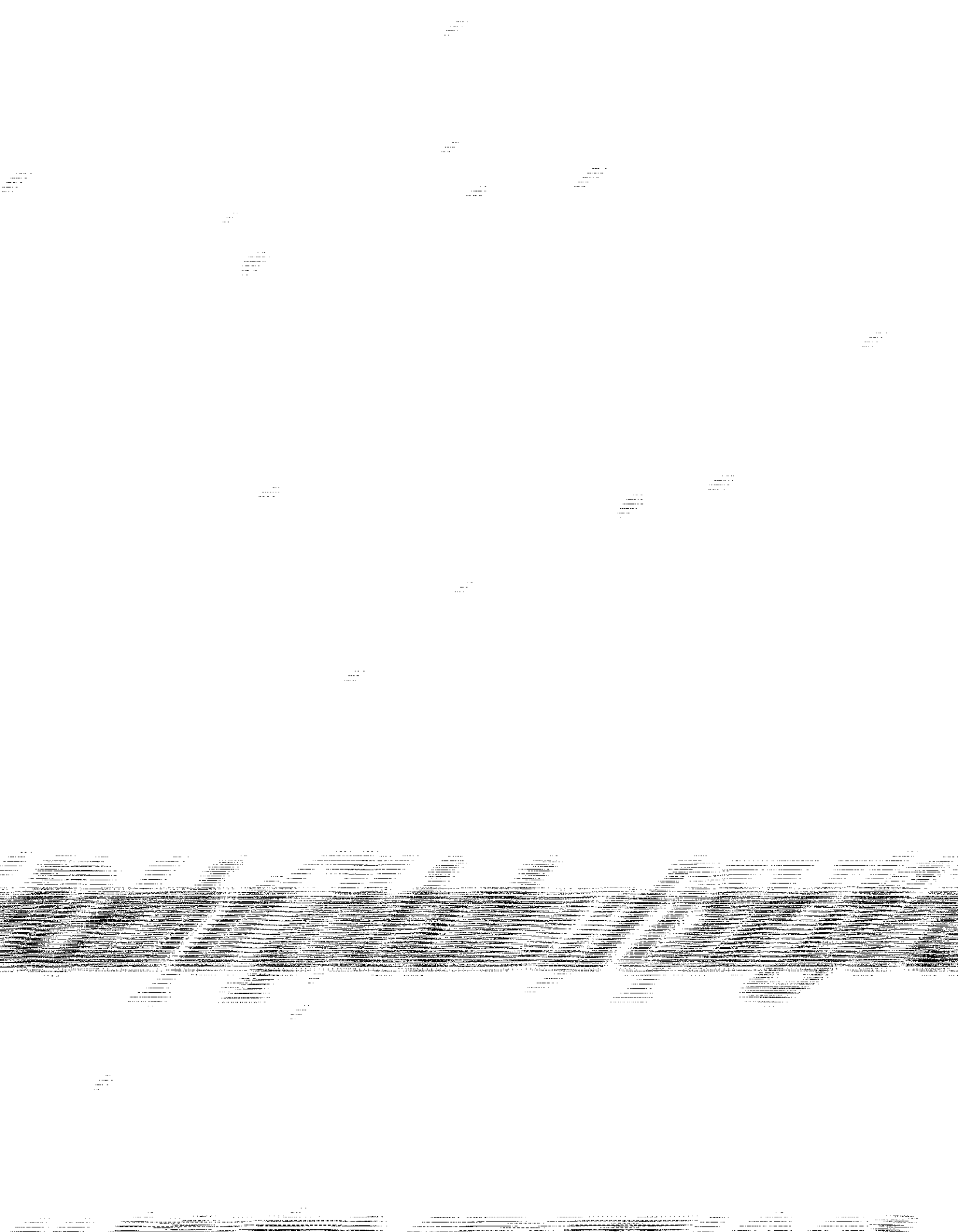
In or around September 1994, Florence Green (hereinafter referred to as "Green") retained Respondent to prevent foreclosure on her home. Respondent informed Green that the bankruptcy court required her to pay One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00) a month to comply with the bankruptcy plan. Respondent collected the monthly payment from Green, but failed to pay the creditors. In February of 1998, due to Respondent's failure to competently and diligently represent Green, the United States Marshall arrested Green and brought her before a Bankruptcy Judge for failure to appear in court pursuant to a show cause order. The Court entered an order restricting Green's eligibility to be a debtor, prohibiting her from filing any bankruptcy petitions in any bankruptcy court in the United States, due to having filed six bankruptcy petitions, five of which were filed without her prior authorization by Respondent. The court informed Green that the Thirty Four Thousand Dollars (\$34,000.00) she had paid Respondent was never sent to her creditors.

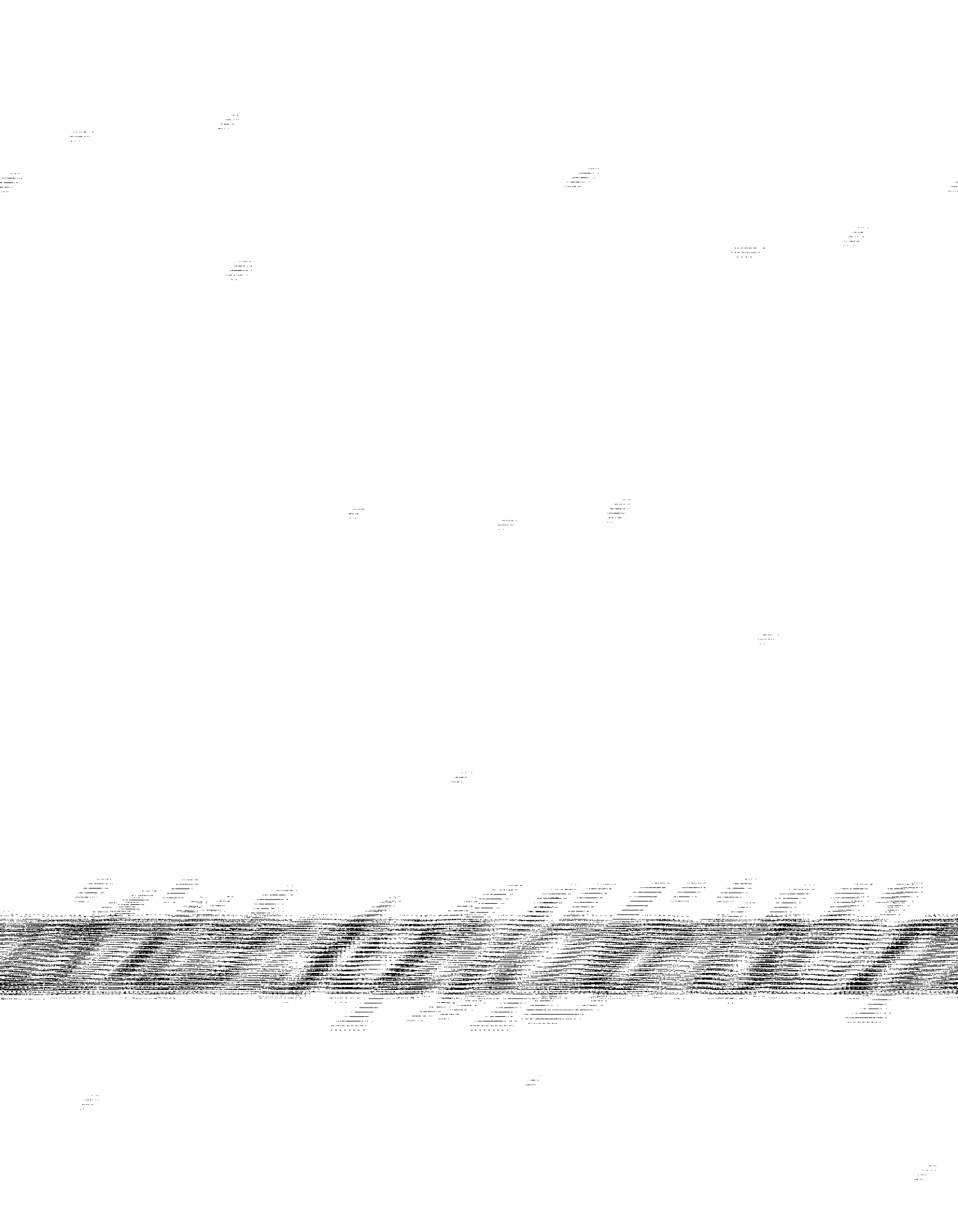
On or about August 20, 1998, the judge presiding signed an AGREED PERMANENT INJUNCTION, DISGORGEMENT OF CLIENT PAYMENTS, AND SANCTIONS against Respondent in Bankruptcy Case No. 97-46805-H5-13, filed by Daniel E. O'Connell, Standing

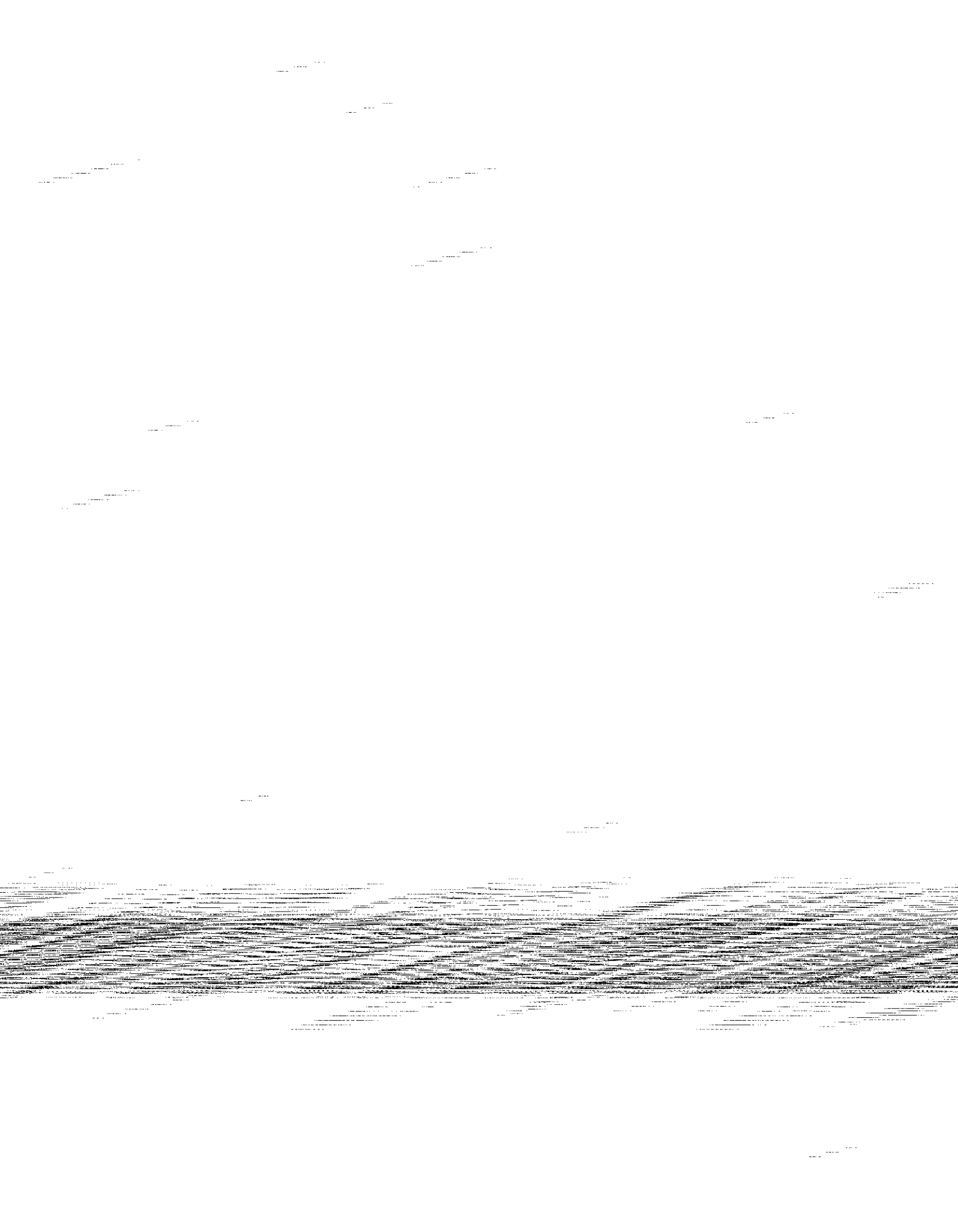


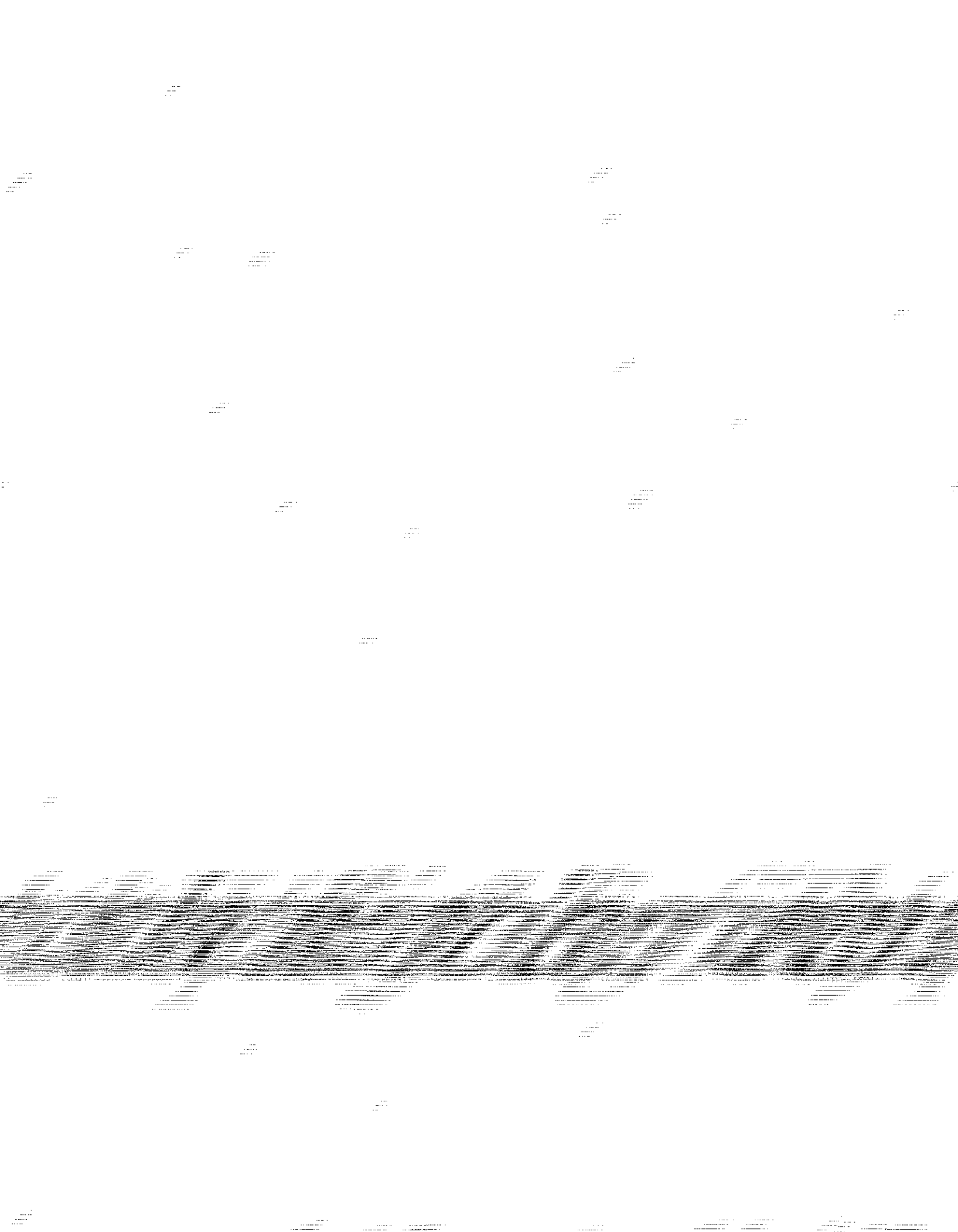


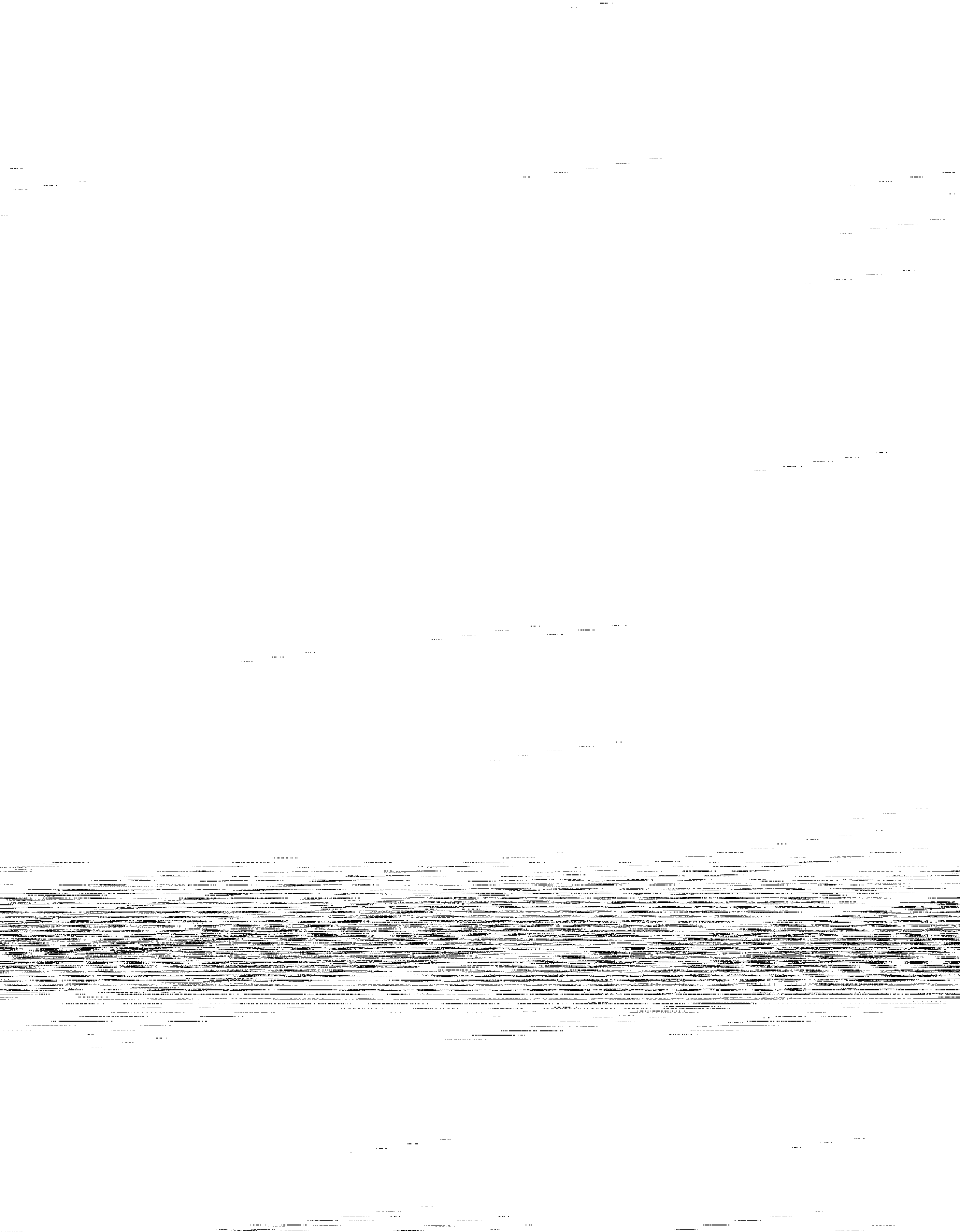


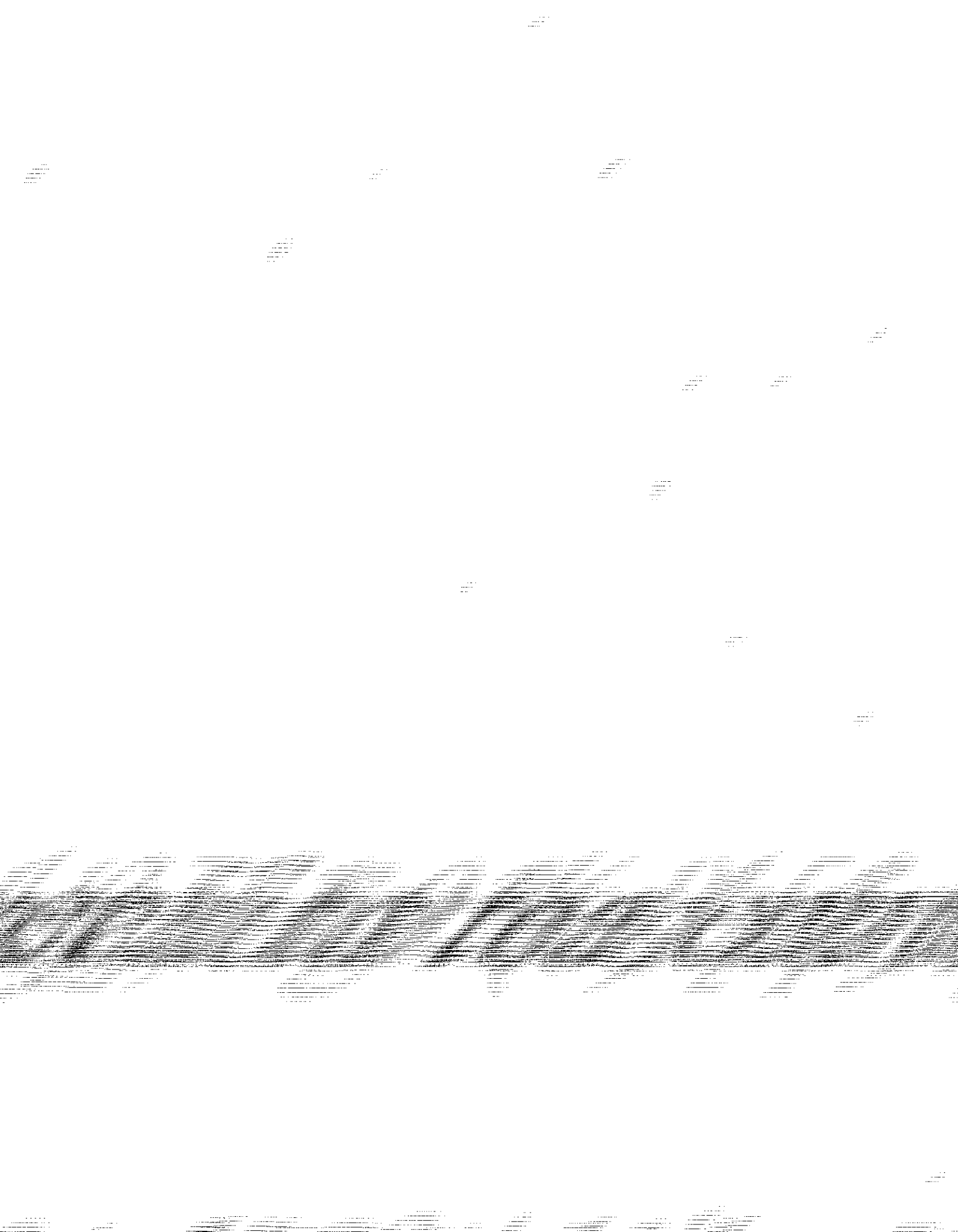


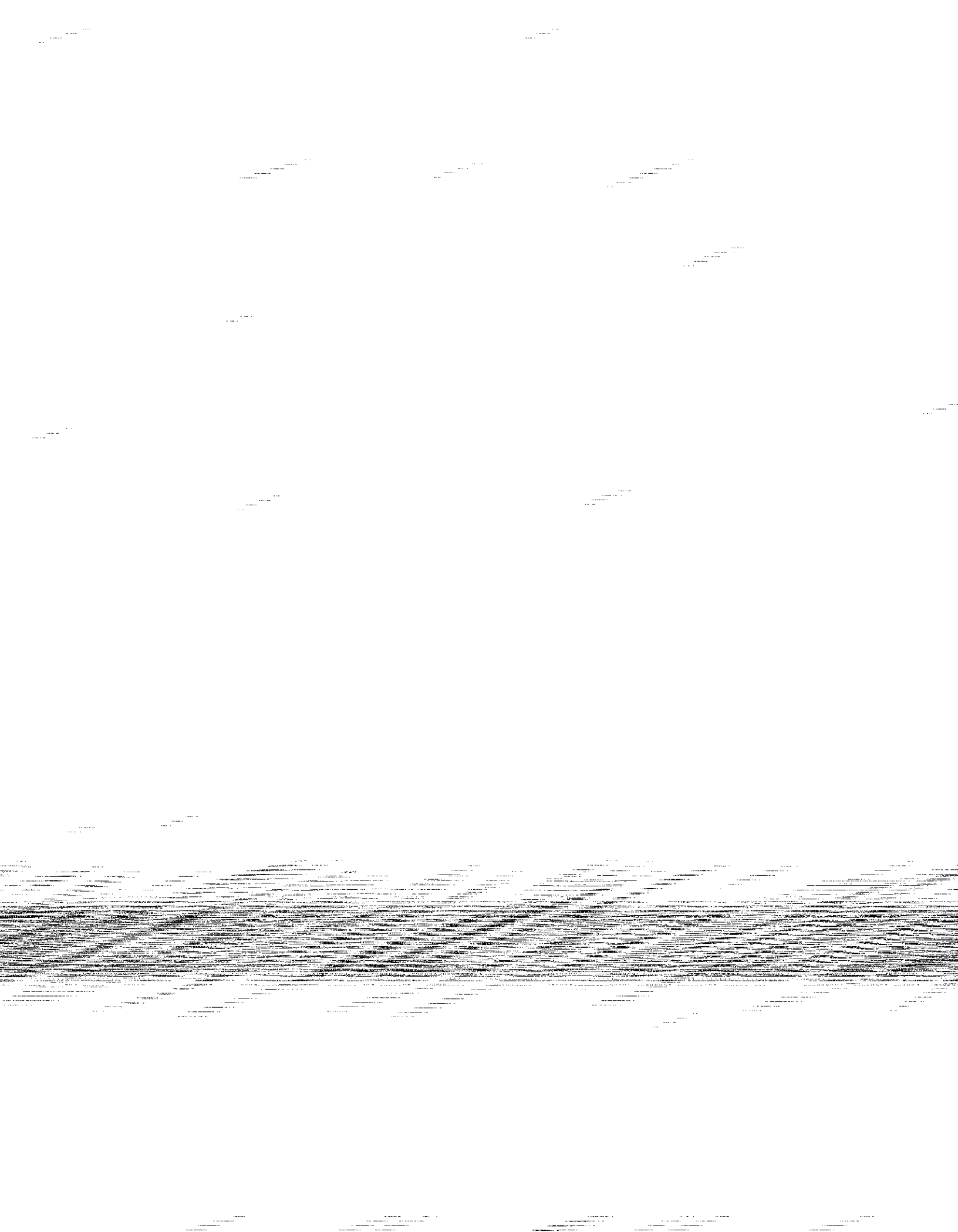
