(1) Definition: A law clerk (a/k/a "Briefing Attorney") is a law school graduate employed for a limited term in a classified position that does not require a law license. This does not include law students employed on a part-time basis while attending law school.

(2) Definition: A court attorney in a classified position that requires a Texas law license. (This does not include court law clerks or "briefing attorneys".)
