# FIFTEENTH COURT OF APPEALS REPORT





## ABOUT THE COURT

The Legislature created the Fifteenth Court of Appeals during the 88th Session in 2023. The Court is composed of a Chief Justice and two justices. The Fifteenth Court's initial term began on September 1, 2024.

The Court has statewide civil intermediate appellate jurisdiction and exclusive intermediate appellate jurisdiction over matters arising out of or related to a civil appeals brought by or against the state or a board, commission, department, office, or other agency in the executive branch of the state government, including a university system or institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, or by or against an officer or employee of the state or a board, commission, department, office, or other agency in the executive branch of the state government arising out of that officer's or employee's official conduct (subject to certain exceptions). In addition, the Fifteenth Court had exclusive jurisdiction over appeals from the Texas Business Court, involving cases dealing with business disputes valued at more than \$10 million for FY 2025, and moving forward with disputes valued at more than \$5 million after House Bill 40 (89th Regular Legislative Session) amended Sections 25A.001(14) and 25A.004 of the Texas Government Code to Modify the definition of a "qualified transaction." The 89th Legislature authorized an additional justice in 2028 and another in 2029 (HB 16, 89th 2nd C.S.).


#### **CASES FILED**

In the Court's first year of operation 279 cases were filed.[1] Approximately 120 existing cases purportedly under the jurisdiction of the 15th Court were transferred from the other courts of appeals. More than 110 cases were filed directly with the Court, and another 23 cases were appeals from the Business Court. The Court also received 28 cases as part of the Supreme Court's docket equalization program which strives to reduce disparities in caseload per justice amongst the courts of appeals.





Excluding Business Court appeals and equalization program transfers, 228 cases were filed. The largest share of cases were classified as administrative law, and the next largest were miscellaneous civil.



#### **CASES DISPOSED**

The Court disposed of 163 cases during FY 2025.[2] Ten cases were equalization transfers, 14 were Business Court appeals, and 23 were transferred to other courts of appeals due to jurisdiction.
