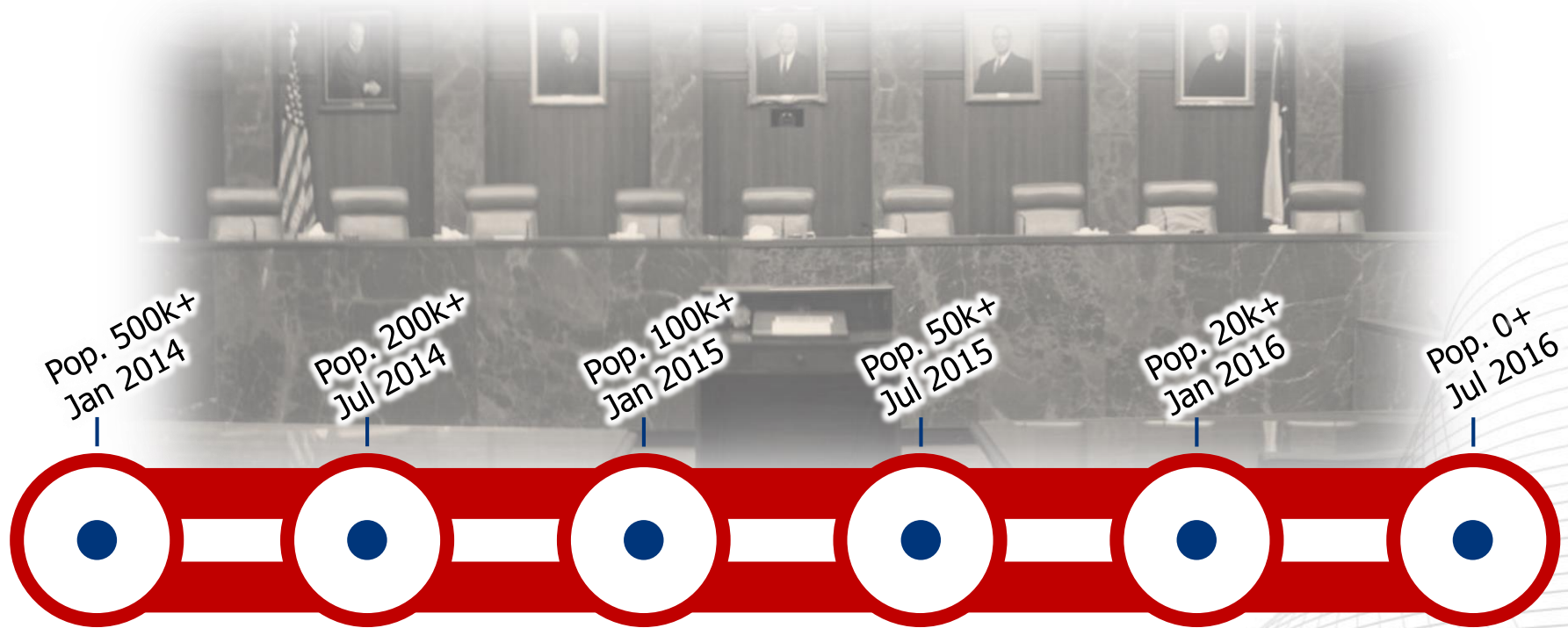

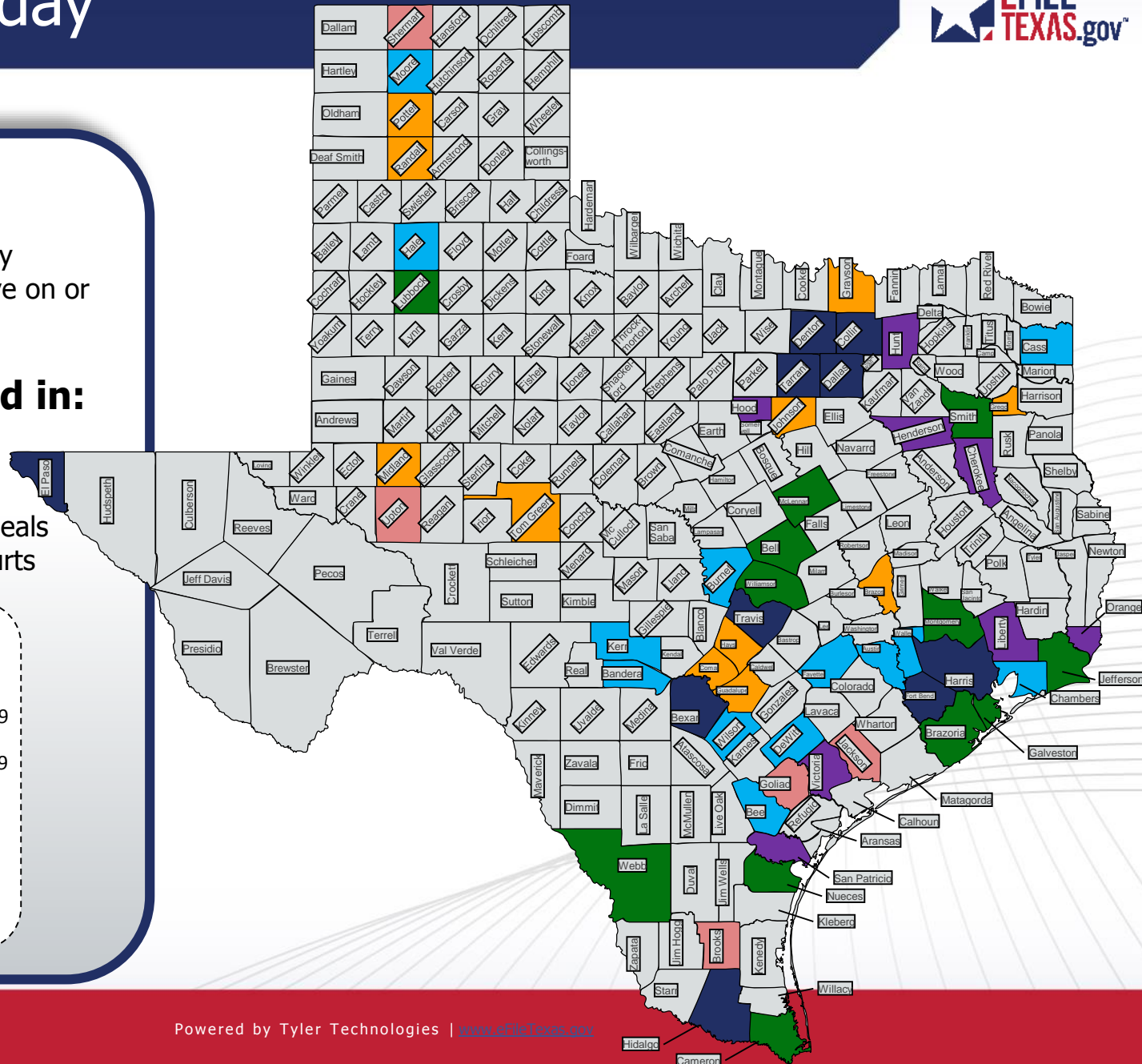

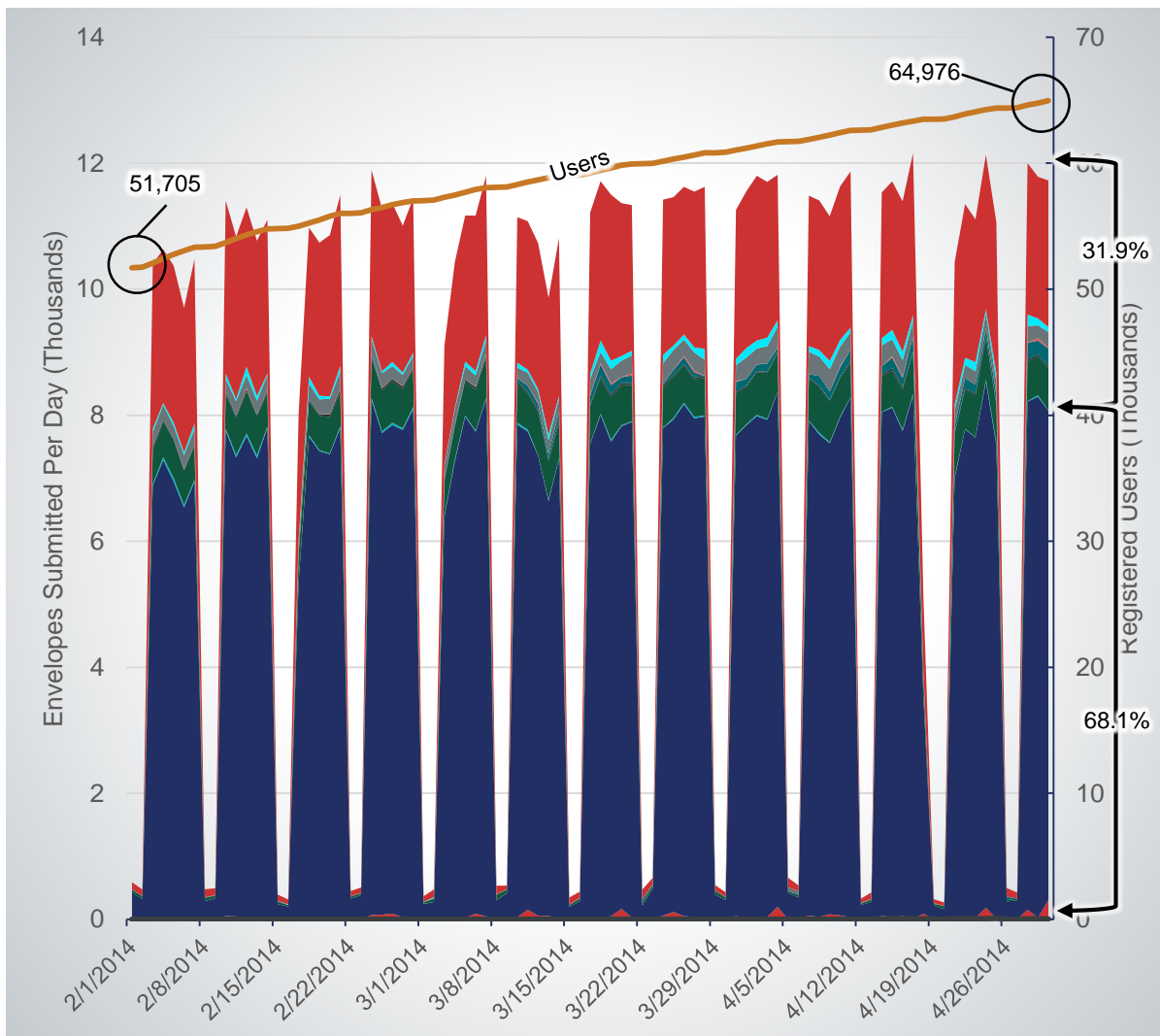

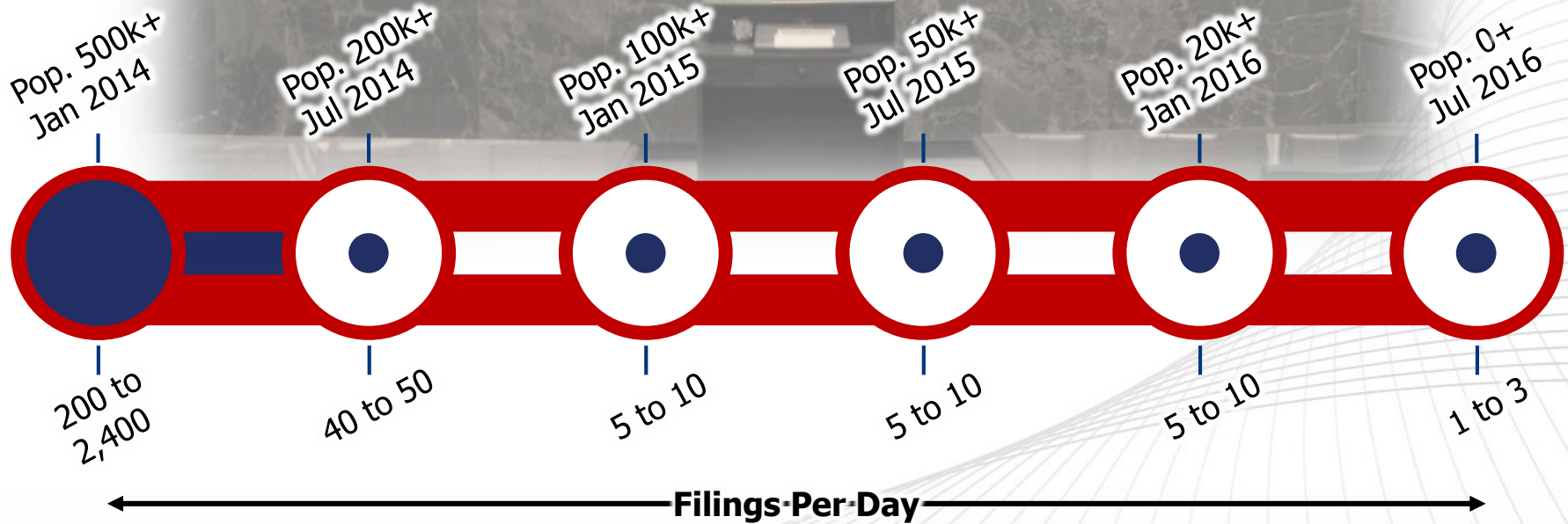
Transaction Volume: 2/1/2014 to 4/30/2014



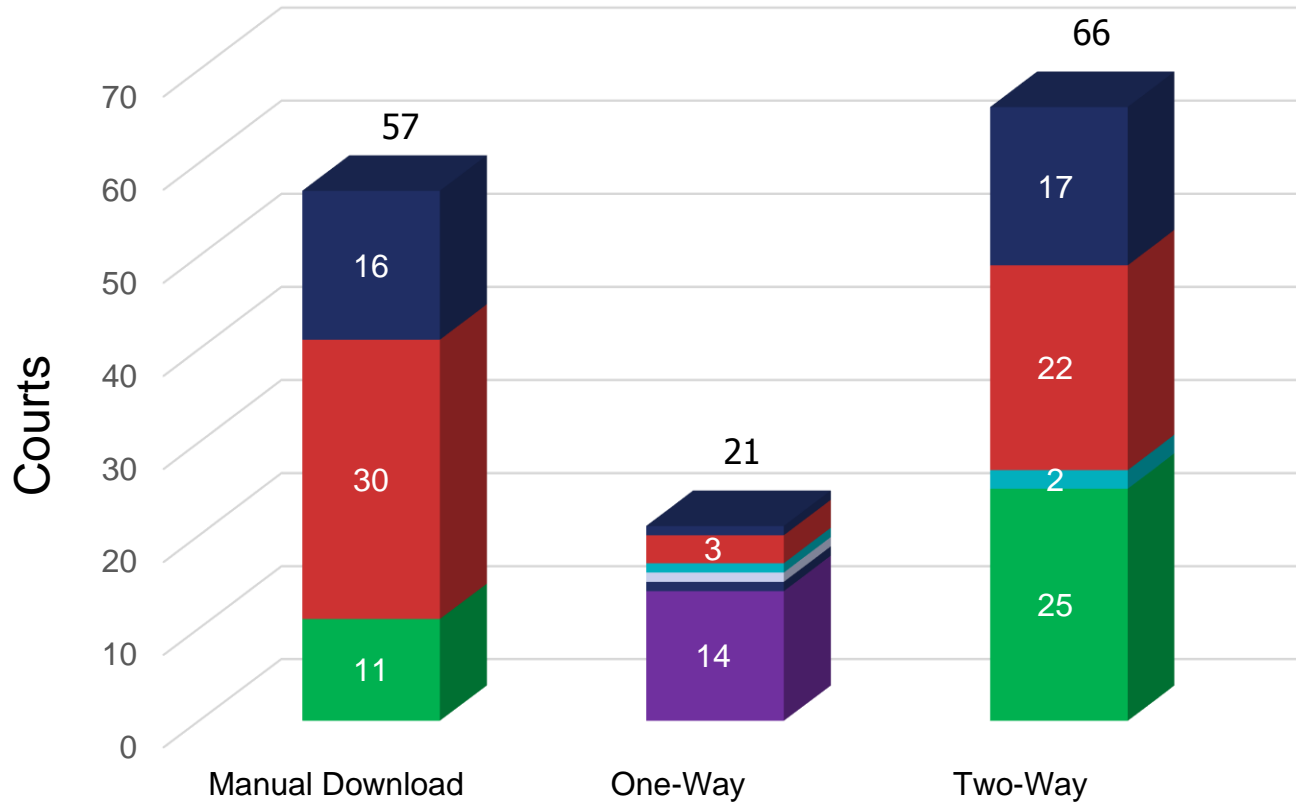
Summary

- ~65k user accounts created to-date
- 125 new user accounts created per day for the month of April
- EFM currently receiving ~11,500 envelopes per day
- State filing portal accounts for 68.1% of transactions; remaining 31.9% stem from commercial EFSP submissions
